Regarding the graces of Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus told St. Faustina,

"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (Diary, 699).

This is an extraordinary promise because normally, when we go to Confession, the eternal punishment due to sin (i.e., hell) is removed, but the temporal punishment due to sin (i.e., purgatory) may still remain (see Ps 99:8).
But ALL sins and punishment are removed by the grace of Divine Mercy Sunday

when we fulfill the conditions of:

- Professing a valid Confession
- Worthily receiving Holy Communion
- Repenting and committing to trying to amend our life.

In fact, the grace of Divine Mercy Sunday has been compared to the grace of Baptism. It forgives all sins and provides for the removal of all punishment due to sin (even for sins forgotten to be confessed) and is fully effective even if our contrition is less than perfect.

Attend the Saturday Vigil or a Sunday Mass + Attend the All Saints Prayer Service at 2:00 pm = Extraordinary Graces!

- * Readings from the Diary of St. Faustina and reflections by Msgr. Marren and Father Dan Rogaczewski
- * Praying of the Litany of Divine Mercy led by Deacon Paul Doppel
- * Veneration of the Divine Mercy Image
- * Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy
- * Close with Benediction

Come and rejoice in the power of God's grace and mercy!

"On that day (Divine Mercy Sunday), the very depths of My tender mercy are opened. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. ... On the day, all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened (Diary, 699)."
