Dear All Saints Parishioners,

St. Vincent de Paul is honored to be the steward of your generosity transforming your monthly donations into hope for parishioners and the Dunwoody community and beyond. We support neighbors impacted by any financial hardship, not just COVID-19, and we often have to turn away families when we have exhausted our monthly funding.

To help defray the financial impact of COVID-19 on our Vincentian clients, the City of Dunwoody has approved a \$50,000 grant through the Vulnerable Population Program funded by the CARES Act. We're grateful to Lynn Deutsch, Mayor of Dunwoody, for including us in the program. But most importantly, we're grateful for All Saints parishioners who sacrifice each month making contributions that help us assist any neighbor in need. These grant funds, however, will not include our Vincentian clients who fall outside the geographical boundaries of the City of Dunwoody. Under the terms of the grant, St. Vincent de Paul is eligible to seek reimbursement only for housing and utility payments that meet the grant criteria of proving job or income losses due to COVID-19. The grant program will extend our reach to additional families through the end of the year.
